Confirmed speakers:

- **Lorraine Moore, the Hub for SUCCESS**, will share the learning from our 5-year independent evaluation, what our data and student voice is telling us and how we have addressed systemic barriers getting in the way of our student's progress.
- **Dr Autumn Roesch-Marsh, University of Edinburgh** will explore how being trauma aware is integral to making sure care experienced students feel connected and feel safe in places of learning.
- **Dr Zoe Baker, University of York** will offer insights into how we better support graduate transitions. The most recent phase of her "Care-Experienced Graduates Research project", seeks to understand care-experienced students' plans for after graduation, their choices and decisions informing these plans, and actual graduate destinations.
- **Debbie Duncan and Louise Martin, Senior Widening Access Support Officers from the University of Strathclyde**, will share the support they have developed for care experienced students, and offer insights into what really makes a difference.
